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Overview

Gareth accepts instructions across Chambers' core practice areas and has particular experience in employment law, discrimination and across the law of negligence. He is regularly on his feet in the Employment Tribunal and civil courts, alongside of which he maintains a busy paperwork practice.

Gareth's employment practice involves routinely appearing multi-day and multi-week Employment Tribunal hearings, as well as public and private preliminary hearings. Recent cases have included claims of discrimination, whistleblowing, breach of contract, restrictive covenants, dismissal and a large array of preliminary issues. He regularly advises on those areas, as well as on matters pertaining to TUPE, trade union rights, tribunal procedure and appeals. Gareth also deals with, and has recently been instructed in, employment matters heard in the civil courts such as injunctive proceedings and breach of contract claims (both intermediate and multi-track).

Gareth is regularly instructed in discrimination claims outside of the employment context in the County Court and First-Tier Tribunal, such as service provision discrimination and in education.

In Gareth's personal injury work and negligence work more generally, he represents both Claimants and Defendants. He accepts instructions in matters brought in the fast, intermediate, and multi-track, and regularly attends the civil courts in CCMCs, applications and final hearings. He has been instructed, and successfully appeared, in cases involving fundamental dishonesty and fraud.

Gareth also accepts instructions in other areas of Chambers' work, such as costs and breach of contract, inquests, information law/privacy rights, professional discipline, and education law.

Employment

Gareth accepts instructions in all areas of employment law and has significant experience across it despite his junior Call. He is accustomed to working in cases ranging from those involving vulnerable claimants to high-net-worth individuals, from small employers to large public bodies and health trusts. His personable style ensures he is adept at managing client relationships throughout.

Recent cases include:

- Successfully defended 10-day victimisation, disability and age discrimination claim for a large public body;
- Successful in 5-day unfair dismissal, reasonable adjustments and s.15 hearing in a claim against a large public body;
- Successfully defended a 5-day discrimination claim and was awarded substantial costs;
- Successfully defended several discrimination claims valued in excess of £100,000 at multi-day hearings;
- Successfully defended an appeal in the EAT on behalf of a charitable organisation relating to issues of economic duress and settlement agreements;
- Successfully defended an appeal in the EAT for a claim struck out at a preliminary stage;
- Represented multiple claimants in a *Hogg v Dover* dismissal claim, as well as a dismissal claim regarding implied terms and unilateral variation;

Negligence

As noted above, Gareth is regularly on his feet in the civil courts and balances that with a paperwork practice in which he regularly drafts statements of case, applications and advises at various stages of proceedings.

Recent cases include:

- Advising on prospects, settlement and quantum in fast, intermediate and multi-track;
- Regularly appearing in proceedings concerning road traffic accidents, employer's liability and public liability (both claimant and defendant);
- Advising on, and defending, a High Court contribution claim;
- CCMC and allocation hearing in a multi-track property damage claim;
- High Court proceedings brought under the Solicitors Act 1974;
- Successfully defending arguments of fundamental dishonesty for claimants on several occasions in fast-track proceedings.

Information Law

Gareth has experience advising and acting in cases involving data protection, the GDPR and privacy rights.

Recent cases include:

- Advising a claimant on liability and quantum in a claim brought against a large public body for breach of data protection;
- Drafting statements of case in a claim for damage and distress following breach of data/privacy rights;

- Advising a defendant regarding proceedings which concerned its actions in responding to a DSAR.

Inquests
